Guide to tickets

Ten Journey tickets

Charged at 8x adult single fare, rounded up to nearest 10p

Special return tickets (Same Day)

Service 20 Hawick to Jedburgh £5.00

 Hawick to Kelso £6.80

Tickets for children

Under 5

Up to four children under the age of 5 can travel for free when accompanied by a responsible, fare-paying passenger.

These children can't:

- take a seat that paying passengers might need
- stay in a buggy in an unsuitable place on the bus

For children under 5 who can't travel for free, different rules apply depending on the Local Authority area you're in.

5–15 year olds

There are different rules on concessions for children between five and 15 depending on the Local Authority area you're in.

Single and return tickets

Children aged between five and 15 years old can travel on child single and return or day ticket.

Tickets for adults

Passengers aged 16 and above pay the full price adult fare.

Singles and return tickets

Single tickets are perfect if you only want to make one journey a day.

Return tickets offer you a discount when travelling between two places and are only valid on the date printed on the ticket.

Concessionary bus pass holders (seniors and disabled)

If you're of retirement age or have a certain disability, you can apply for a Concessionary Bus Pass from your local council. It'll let you travel for free on our buses.

You can normally travel after 09:30 until 23:00 on weekdays and all day at weekends and on bank holidays. Some Local Councils have different rules on when you can use your pass.

If you need assistance from our driver please ask he/she will be happy to assist

Animals

Guide dogs and assistance dogs can travel for free at all times.

Other small, well-behaved animals may travel for free with the driver's permission. Animals may not be allowed to travel if the bus is very busy or there are already animals travelling on the bus.

Animals are not allowed to sit on the seats.

Penalty charges

You must have a valid ticket or pass for your journey. If you don't show your ticket or pass when we ask, we may issue a penalty charge of £50.
